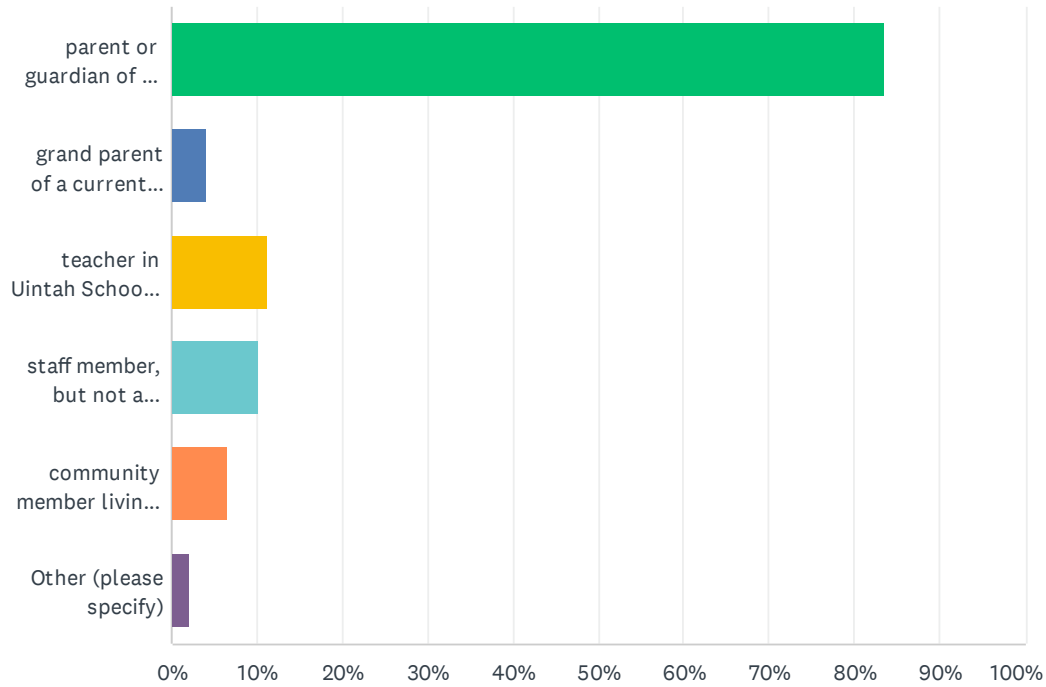

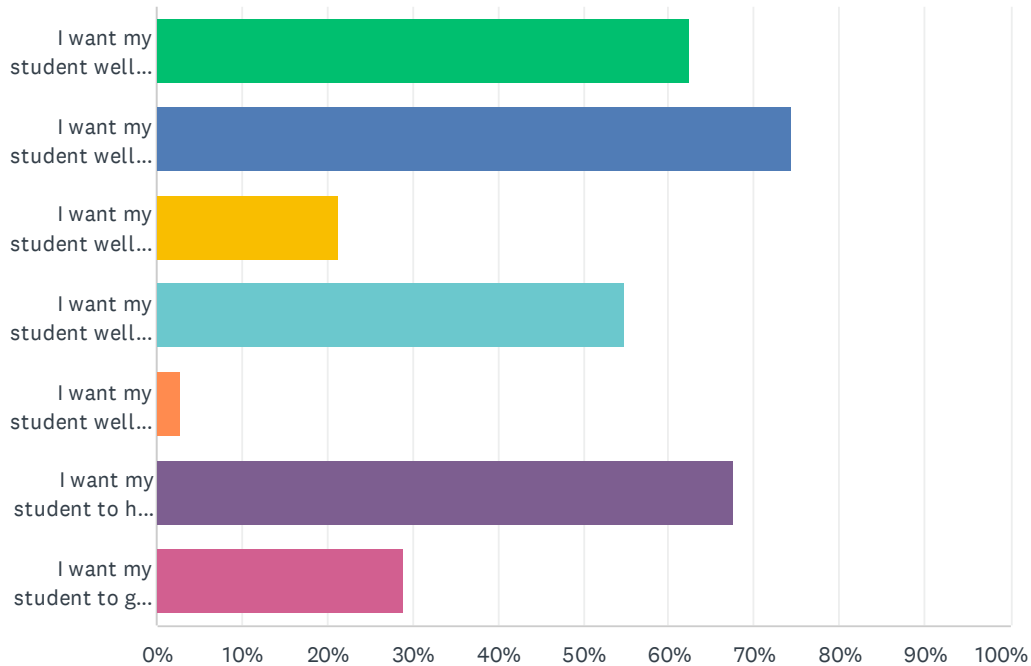

## Q2 Which of the following describes what you want for your student(s) upon graduation from Uintah School District. Please choose up to 3 items.

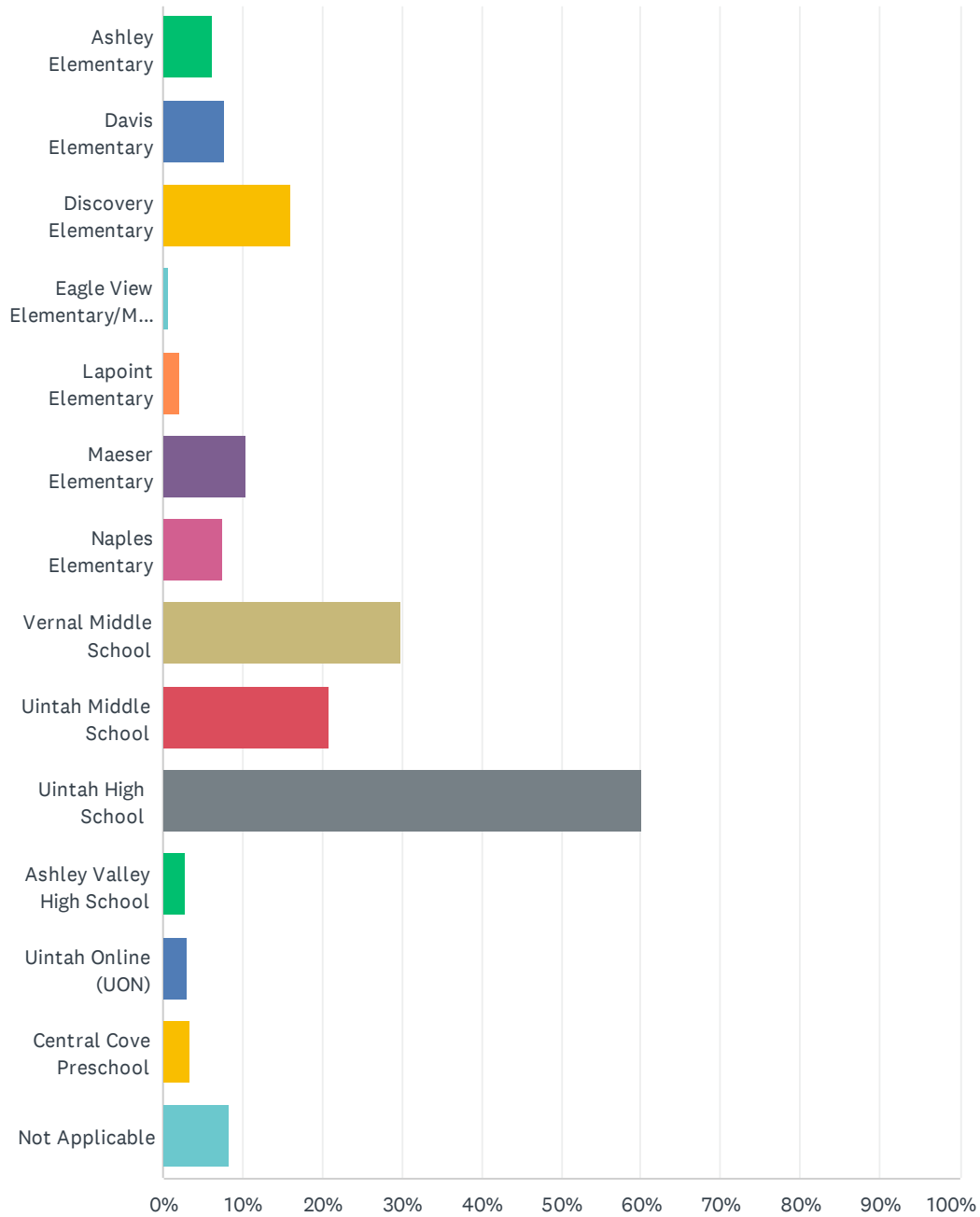

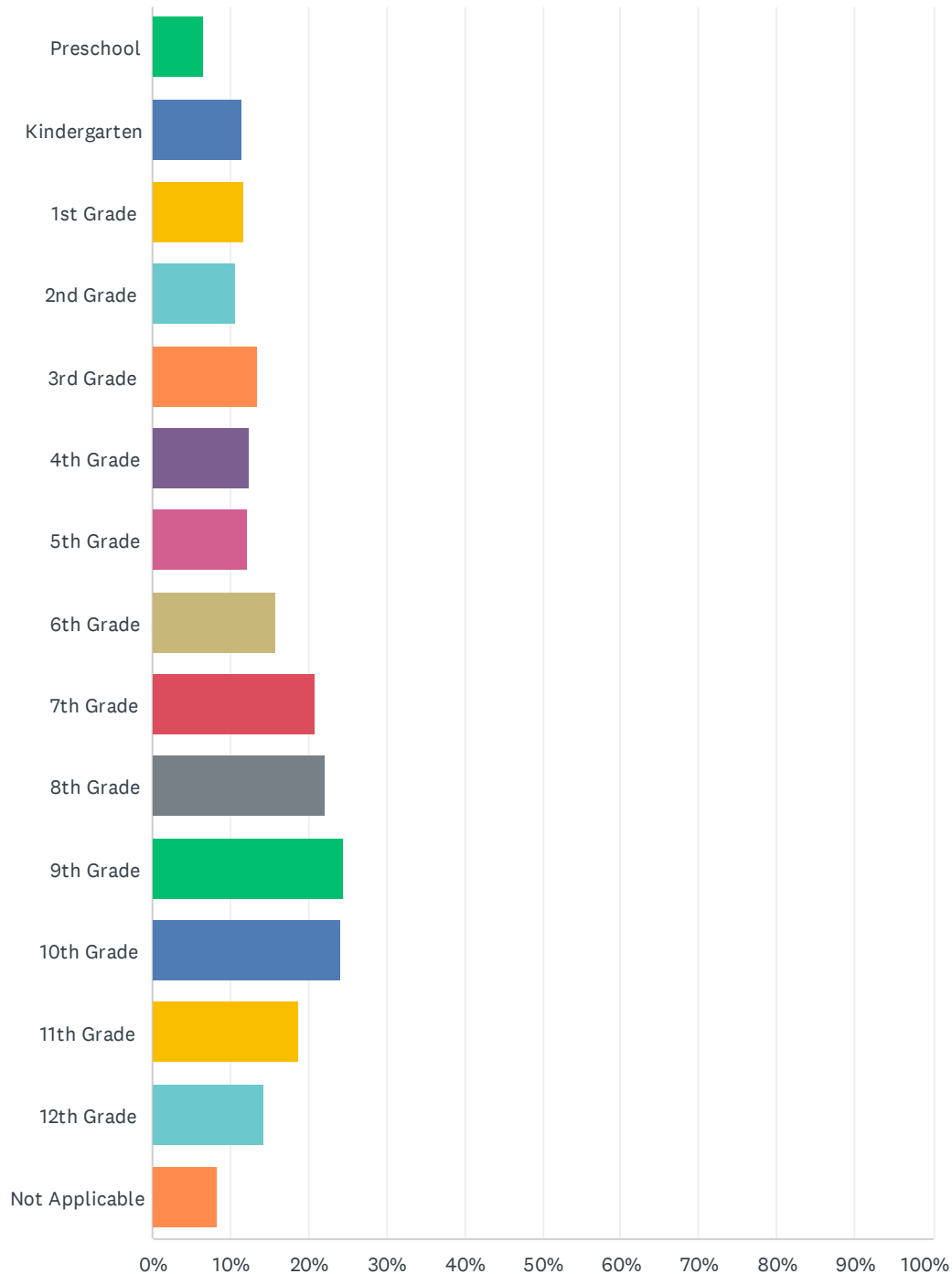

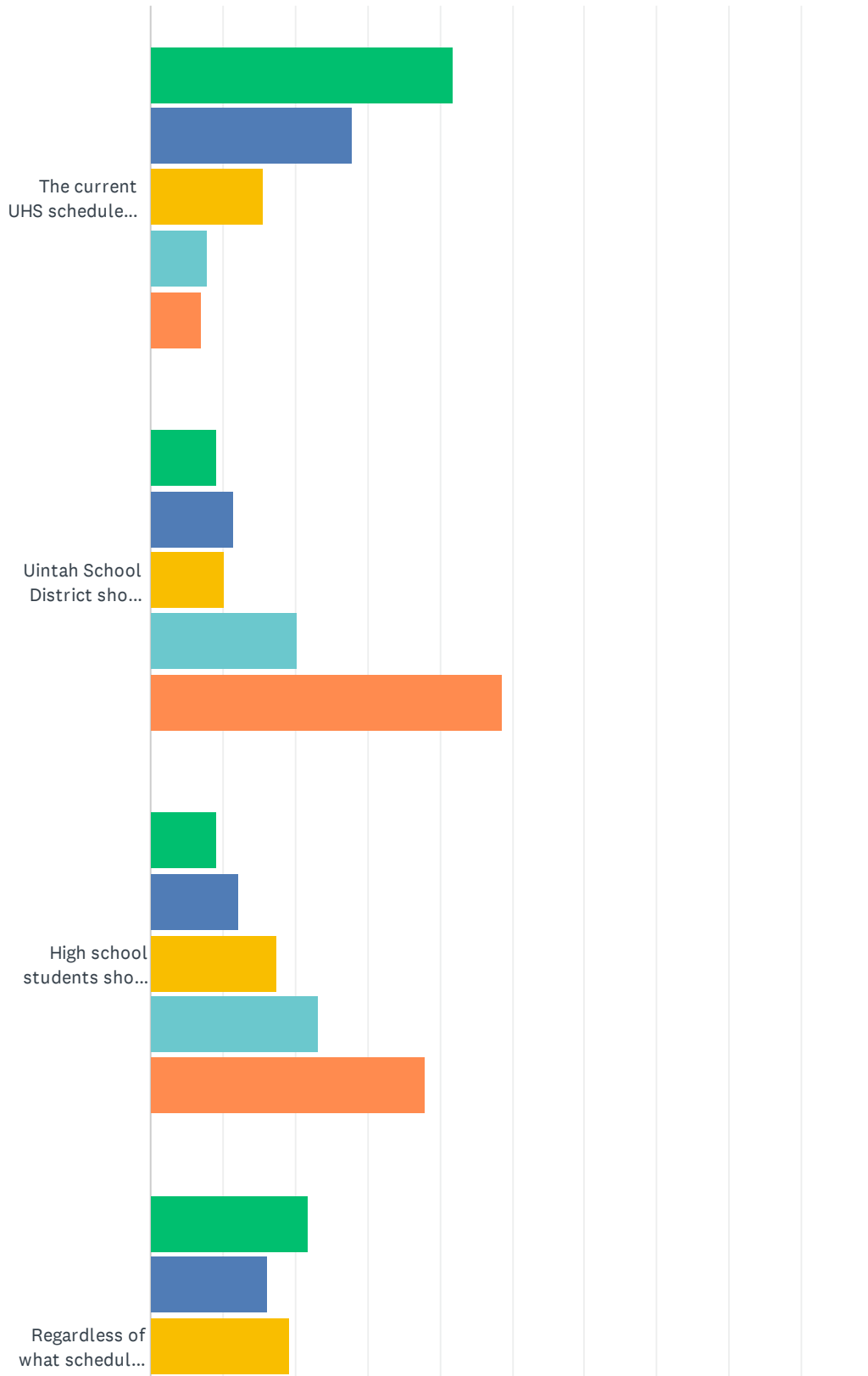

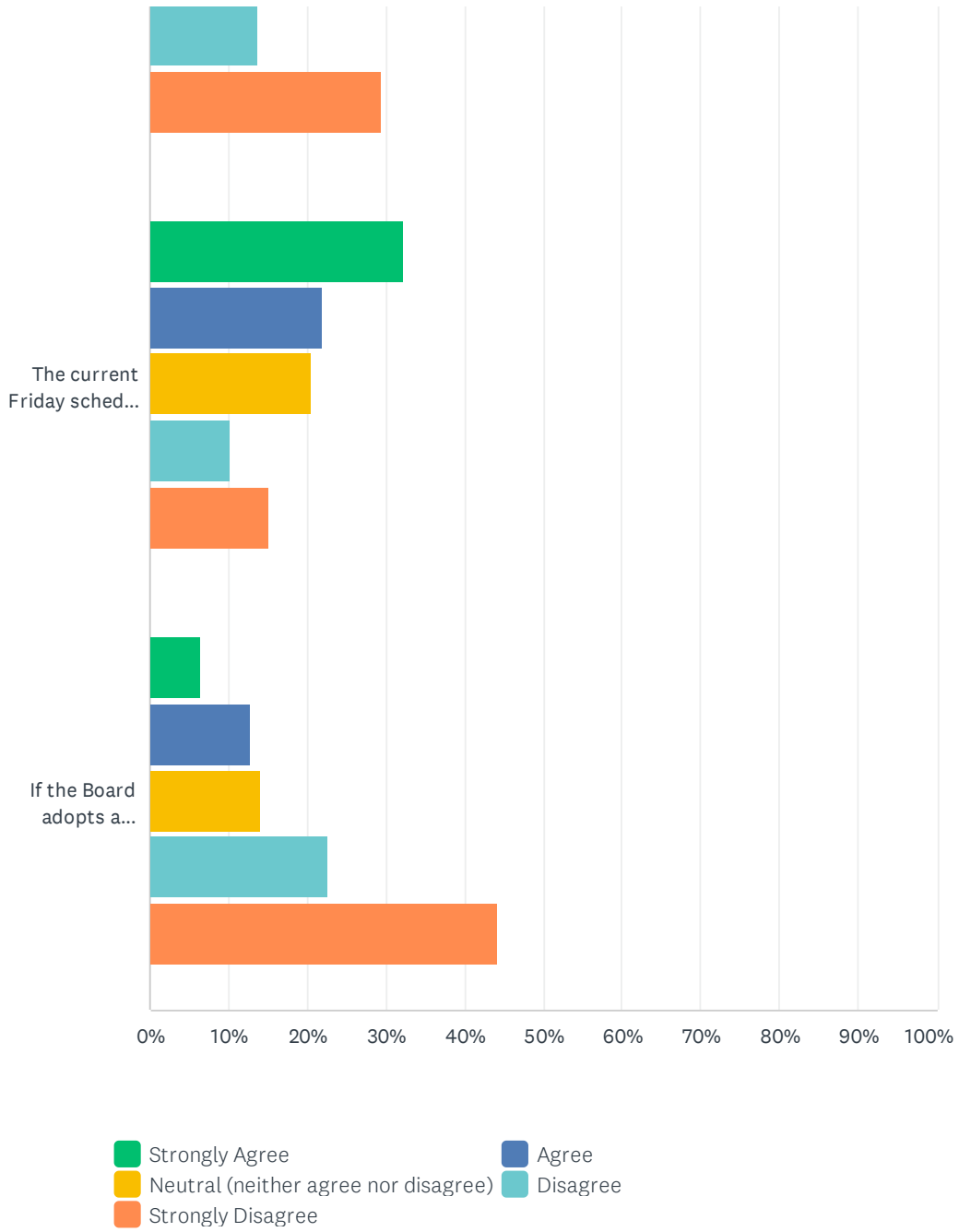

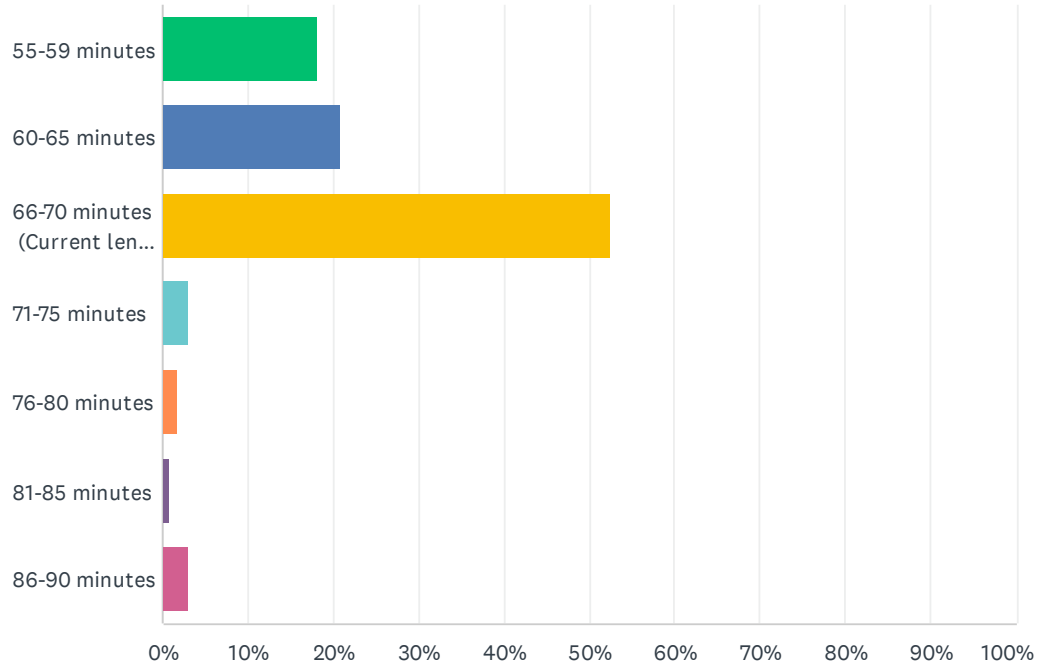

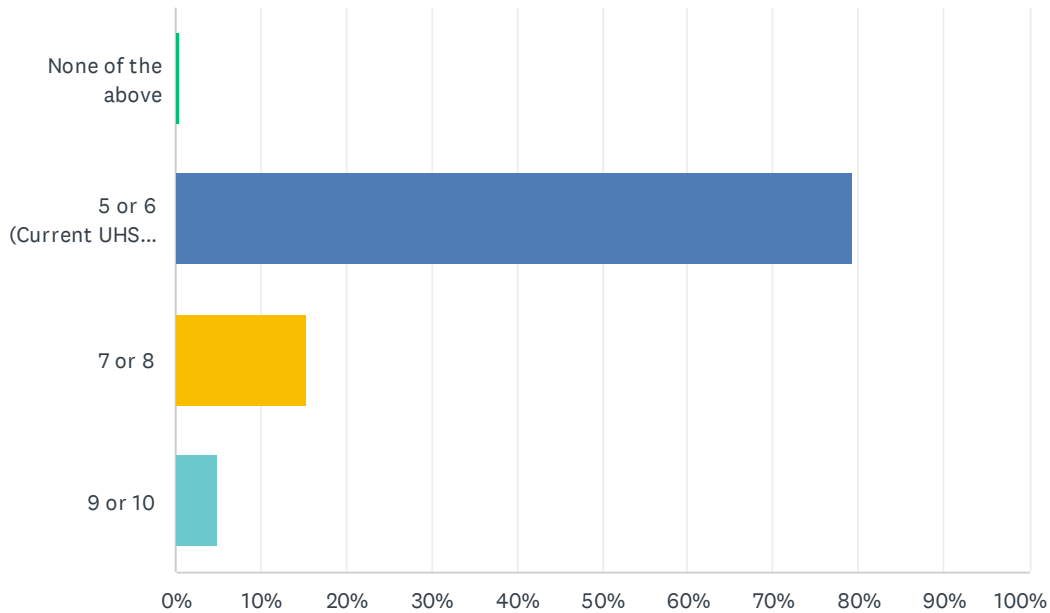

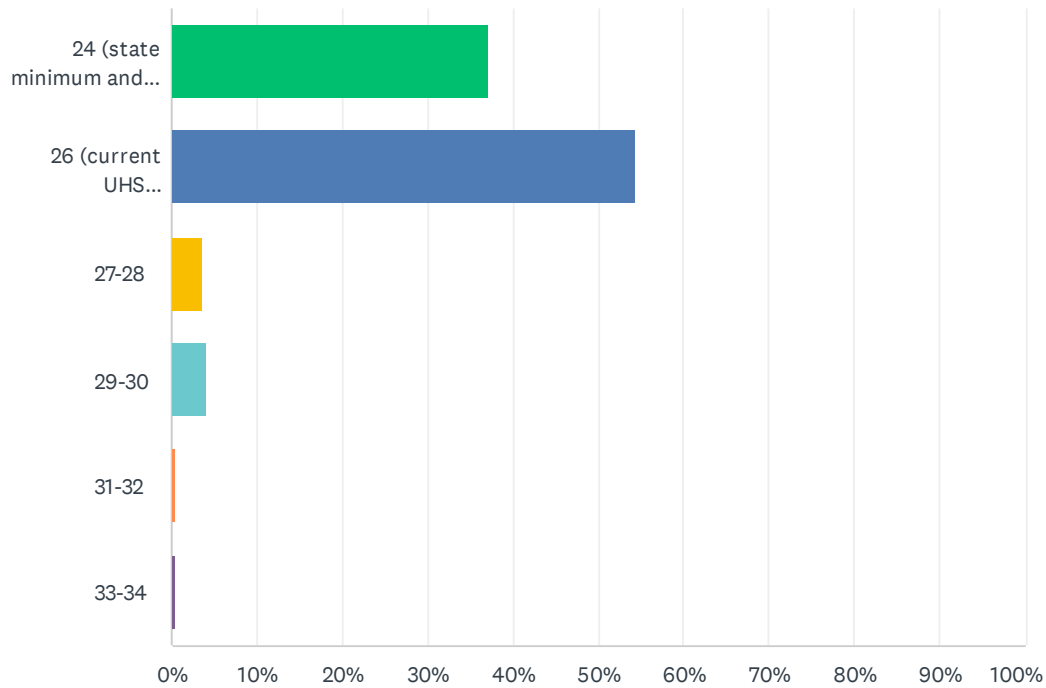

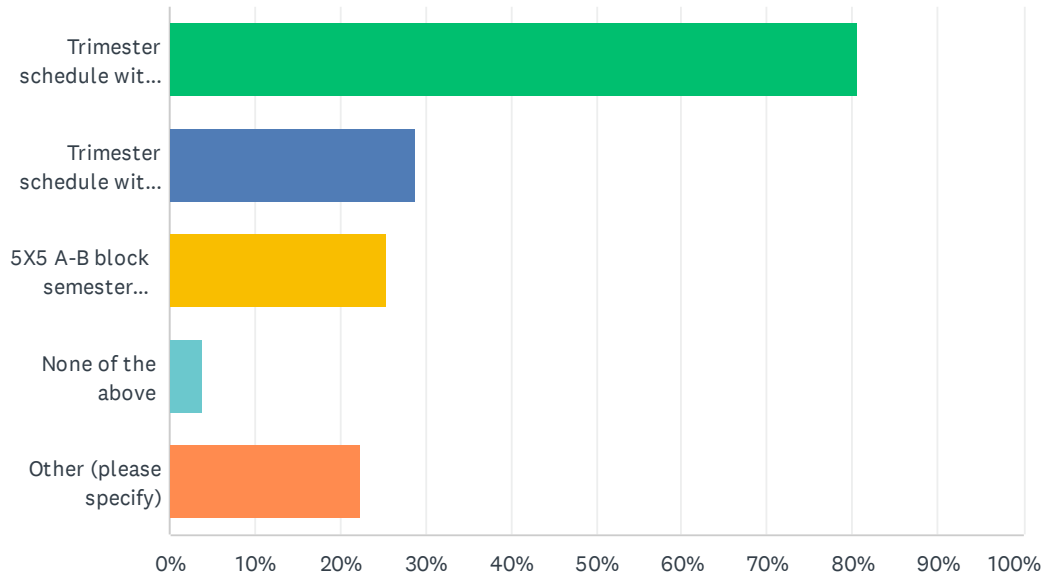

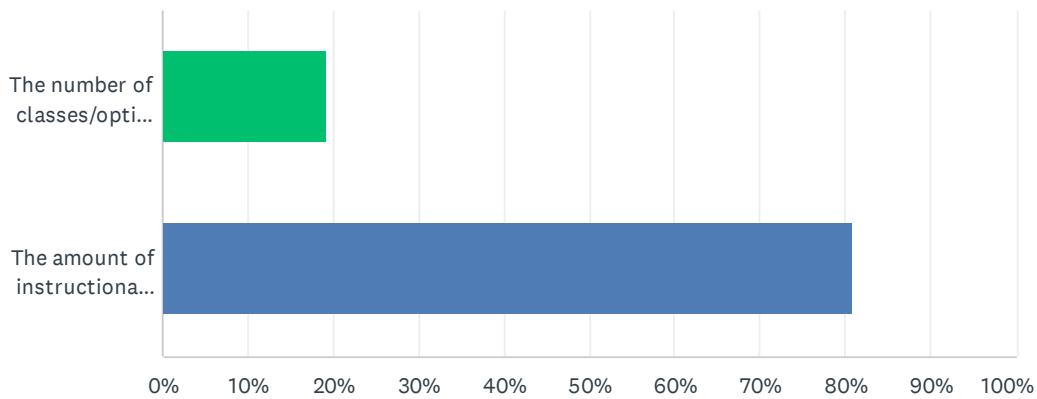

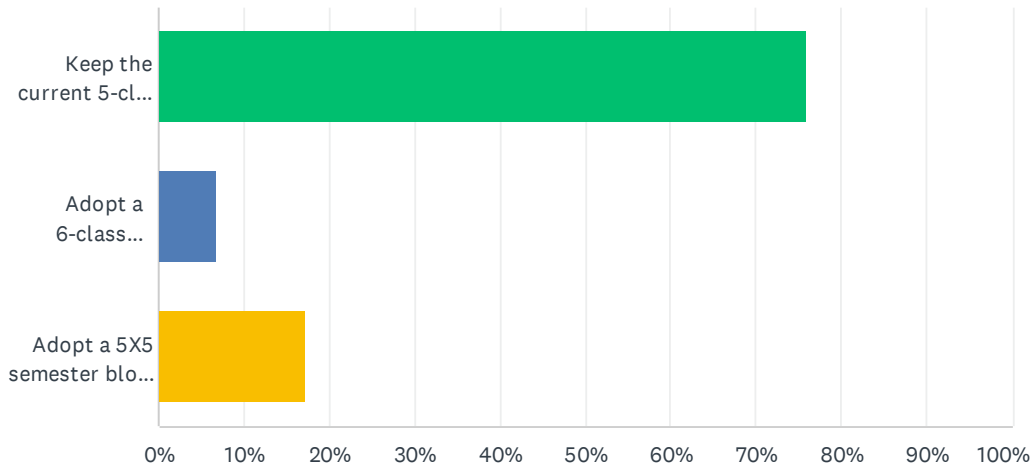

Keep the current 5-class trimester schedule in place with 68 minute classes and 15 annual course offerings with a graduation requirement of 26 credits.	75.99% 655
Adopt a 6-class trimester schedule with 55 minute classes and 18 annual course offerings. This option would cut 21 hours of instructional time per course credit and the graduation requirement would increase from 26 to 32 credits.	6.84% 59
Adopt a 5X5 semester block schedule with ten 68 minute class periods (5 each day) using an A-B day rotation with up to 20 annual course offerings. Select core classes will be "expanded" or taught every day for the year, increasing instructional time and extra support for students. This option will cut 32 hours of instructional time per course credit in classes that are not "expanded" or taught every day. Graduation requirements for this option would increase from 26 to 30 credits.	17.17% 148
